### **Youth Faith Formation Mission News**

Te are off to a great start to get our Youth Faith Formation Mission up and running by August 25<sup>th</sup> for all grades 1-12! All young disciples are welcome to come, both Confirmed and not-yet-confirmed as well as non-Catholics. High schoolers and parents: Mark your calendars for the start of a brand new mission on August 25th using "Why Believe." It will be great for our high school age disciples whether or not they are Confirmed. Have they decided for themselves why they believe, why they are Catholic, and how it benefits them?

Since this is a whole new restart and previous registrations are a couple years old, we are requiring all families to register for this new mission with current information. All Catholic families must be registered in a parish. If they are not from our two parishes, then they need permission from their parish priest. Non-Catholic families can just complete a YFF Mission registration.

Grades 1 – 5 will meet weekly from 3:45 – 5:00 pm on Wednesday afternoons unless we are able to shift to an earlier time on early release days. Snacks will be served in their mission rooms from 3:30 - 3:45 pm if they prove to be responsible young disciples who can clean up after themselves! We had to change the start time for our evening sessions to 6:30 pm! Grades 9 – 12 are meeting in conjunction with the St. Piux X Parish youth disciples who start 6:30 pm due to their young disciples grades 1 - 8shifting to evening sessions.

Be sure to check our website, www.sacredhearted.org for more information as YFF plans unfold. Contact our new Youth Faith Formation Coordinator Joane Beringer to volunteer in any way! We still need catechists for 5<sup>th</sup> grade in the afternoon & 7th grade in the evening. We have plenty of substitute catechists; so, don't worry about not having a replacement when needed!

# Your Parish Priest

Greetings Faithful Parishioners in Christ,

I am thankful to Bishop Donald DeGrood for assigning me to be your parish priest here as of this past July 1st, 2021. I did not realize how great of an opportunity this is for our parishes and for me. After five years, I was just getting done addressing the deferred maintenance issues in my two parishes and started to begin having the opportunity to lead my parishes into a "new springtime in the Church" as St. Pope John Paul II envisioned it at the turn of the new millennium by facilitating a "New Evangelization." I was ready to revitalize the Religious Education program and begin an evangelization and discipleship process in my parishes. At the same time, we received a new bishop with a new vision for our diocese who invested a full-time priest position in the Office of Discipleship & Evangelization. I met with Fr. Scott Traynor, who is in that position, about the direction I have been going in my parishes and the direction our new bishop envisions. Please prayerfully consider God calling you to make a commitment and be a part of our parish teams. Can you at least commit to being a catechist for one month? We could rotate parents every week or two but our young disciples need more consistency than that.

It is very fulfilling to do God's Will by answering His call. If He is calling you, then He is also equipping you to do His Will. I am here to help every single one of our catechists. You know I am passionate about this enough to know I am here to serve you according to your needs. We need to be effective instruments of God so that He can form our young people and youth through His Love in us to make His children into "lifelong Catholic Missionary Disciples." This takes a discipleship team effort by all of us doing our parts , and how fulfilling it will be!

I am looking forward to our first Youth Faith Formation Mission year at Sacred Heart and St. Pius X Parishes and sharing our Faith and our love for the Lord and His Church with our youth for their sake and His Glory!

Scott Hahn Reflects on the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6, 10 Psalm 45:10, 11, 12, 16 1 Corinthians 15:20-27 Luke 1:39-56

On this feast, we praise God who has taken the sinless Virgin Mary, body and soul, into His glory.

In our first reading, from Revelation, we find God's temple in heaven opened and the Ark of the Covenant revealed. The most sacred item in Israel's history, the Ark had been missing since the Temple's destruction in 586 B.C. Thus, John reports some startling news. Even more startling is his revelation that the sacred vessel is now a woman, who is mother of the royal Son of David, the Messiah.

Of this woman, then, we sing to God as the ancient Israelites sang: "The queen stands at your right hand, arrayed in gold." In the court of King Solomon, we glimpse Israel's traditional arrangement: Solomon's mother, Bathsheba, takes her place at the king's right hand (see 1 Kings 2:19).

At Mary's Assumption, as we see in Revelation, the queen once again takes her place at the right hand of the Son of David.

Our second reading shows us why this is fitting: "in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order." What is implicit in St. Paul's statement is revealed in Revelation. The consummation of Christ's work has begun, as is proper, with the Assumption of the queen mother.

John's Apocalypse shows also the fulfillment of our Gospel. There, Mary, pregnant with Jesus, retraces the steps of David as he brought the Ark to Jerusalem (see 2 Samuel 6). Mary "arose and went" into the hill country, just as David "arose and went" to that region. Upon Mary's arrival, Elizabeth is awestruck, just as David was before the Ark. The encounter causes the baby John to leap with excitement, as David leapt before the Ark. And Mary stayed in the "house of Zechariah" for "three months," as the Ark remained in the "house of Obededom" for the same period.

Mary is the vessel of God's presence, and she is queen mother. She reigns now in splendor with Jesus in the heavenly Jerusalem.
